Objectives

1. Review the current immunization schedule for all age groups, from infancy to older adulthood;
2. Identify listed vaccine side effects and contra-indications;
3. Recognize the magnitude of vaccine preventable respiratory illness;
4. Review the available vaccines to prevent respiratory illness and determine high risk groups that would most benefit from these vaccines;
5. Discuss immunization for patients who are or who will become immune suppressed;
6. Identify strategies to improve vaccination rates.

Mastering Migraine: From Quick Relief to Long-Term Control

1. Diagnose migraine and differentiate from other headache types;
2. Compare and contrast available treatments for acute management of migraine;
3. Discuss non-pharmacological treatment recommendations and identify common triggers and lifestyle factors that contribute to migraine frequency;
4. Optimize treatment based on response;
5. Identify the indications for preventive treatment of migraine and review the available options.
