Message from the president



Dear colleagues,

As we enter an already busy Fall, here is an update on the files that directly affect your practices and on which your Association remains actively engaged.

Follow-up on the new *Accord-cadre*: Remuneration in first and second-line care

In its memo issued earlier this week, the FMOQ shared its communications plan to present members with the details arising from the new *Accord-cadre*. With respect to the new remuneration model in first-line care (*modèle combiné*: 50% capitation, 30% fee-for-service and 20% hourly rate), a video capsule followed by a webinar are planned. A series of communications is also planned, along with a frequently asked questions section and a remuneration simulator once the quantum amounts have been determined. With respect to second-line sectors, the FMOQ indicates that work is underway to proceed with the disbursement of the amounts concluded.

We are closely monitoring the situation and remain available to receive your questions and concerns.

IPSPL update

The monthly amount of \$3,615 provided for the integration of IPSPL into practice settings will now be indexed annually to inflation. In addition, as part of an agreement aimed at enrolling 500,000 patients by 2030, including 62,000 in the current year, IPSPL will now be required to enroll patients under their own name rather than through a delegation process. DAAMM, Échographie guidée, CNESST and Transport hélicoptéré

An agreement has been reached between the negotiating parties regarding DAAMM, *échographie guidée* and CNESST. With respect to the *transport hélicoptéré*, it is currently being finalized. The FMOQ will be providing further details shortly.

DSN update

When it was implemented last May, the DSN resulted in an expected but nevertheless considerable organizational slowdown. For some of our members, this has translated into additional working hours, a reduction in clinical volume, and challenges related to receiving investigation results, among other issues. Since then, we have been actively monitoring developments on this file and have made representations to the FMOQ, which has expressed being sensitive of the impacts associated with the launch of the DSN. Analyses are currently underway within the FMOQ team.

PTEM 2027: Recognition of care provided to the *bassin de desserte*

The DTMF recently announced a significant development: the allocation of positions for *nouveaux facturants* to regions serving a *bassin de desserte*. Thus, in Montreal, since we, family physicians, provide care to approximately 400,000 patients who do not reside on the island, 13 new positions have been granted. Your Association welcomes this recognition of your contribution to the *bassin de desserte*, in addition to the Montreal population. Furthermore, given the crucial importance of recognizing our profession and expertise, we remain convinced that a structured and collaborative review of the PTEM and AMP systems remains essential.

Quebec election campaign and our representation

The Quebec provincial election campaign is well underway. We are continuing our outreach and advocacy activities with candidates across the island of Montreal. Several of you have also added your voices to ours by contacting your respective local candidates. Thank you for your contribution! Together, our voice is strong and united!

We also continue to represent you within the FMOQ's governing bodies. The reality of medical practices in Montreal, diverse and unique, which you carry out

with dedication, both in first- and second-line care, remains at the heart of our mission. You can also count on our commitment on October 3rd at the *Conseil des délégués de la FMOQ* meeting.
